Re: Waste Management Act Permitting Requirements for Tailings Cycloning Operation

This letter is to confirm Pollution Prevention's comments on the proposed tailings cycloning operation. We have no concerns with regards to cycloning for the construction of the tailings embankment on the upstream side since all materials report directly to the tailings impoundment. Based on the findings presented in the report "Tailings Cyclone Sands Geochemical Evaluation", December 2, 1998, prepared by Mount Polley Mining Corporation, a permit amendment is not required for construction on the downstream side. It is presumed that the till core will remain as part of the design and that a seepage collection system will be constructed to ensure that seepage from the cycloned sands is returned to the tailings impoundment.

To confirm the above assumptions and to ensure adequate environmental protection we understand that Mount Polley Mining will provide the following:

- 1. the results of a risk assessment of the tailings system, such as a Failure Modes and Effect Analysis
- 2. a copy of the finalized impoundment dam and seepage collection system design report
- 3. an updated Spill Contingency Plan and Operations, Maintenance, and Surveillance Manual for the tailings facilities which address the findings of the risk assessment
- 4. an updated geochemical evaluation report that includes the most recent kinetic test results and addresses MELP comments provided in a letter dated February 12, 1999

We expect that the above items will be addressed prior to the commencement of full scale cyclone operation on the downstream side of the tailings impoundment.

Request for New Variance

Mount Polley Mining Corporation (MPMC) is again applying for a new variance to be granted allowing dumping clean from the waste dumps without the provision for a dump person.

I request that you consider granting the new variance for a period longer than six months.

Reports

The foreman's reports on dump conditions are available for inspection at the MPMC Pit Office. The OHSC includes the operating dump in the inspection tours, reviews and signs the dump logbook, and submits meeting minutes to the Ministry of Mines. In summary, the records show that the dump has been operated as per the agreed MPMC dumping procedures

Consultants Geotechnical Review

Geotechnical consultants, Golder Associates Ltd. prepared a dump inspection report dated August 1999 titled; *Review of Waste Dump Instability*. The report addresses a "small, shallow seated slough" which occurred on June 15, foundation material conditions and alternative strategies for development.

The 1150m platform has been advanced as per the recommendation in paragraph 2, page 5 of the report. No further sloughs at the toe have been observed.

Dump Log Book

As per item 6 of your letter, a dump logbook has been developed which has been used by the shiftbosses to enter all dump inspection information for every shift. The oncoming shifter initials the book and the OHSC reviews and signs the book every tour. The book is available for inspection in the Pit Office.
